2 Boehringer Ingelheim Fonds

The Boehringer Ingelheim Fonds (BIF) awards travel grants of up to three months to doctoral and post-doctoral researchers from all over the world who are conducting experimental projects in basic biomedical research.

6 Franco-German University (DFH)

With the aim of networking researchers and developing Franco-German research dialogue, the Franco-German University (Deutsch-Französische Hochschule – DFH / Université Franco-Allemande – UFA) promotes Franco-German events for junior researchers (doctoral and post-doctoral researchers), e.g., research workshops and summer schools.

7 Fonds der Chemischen Industrie

Funding is provided for chemistry-related conferences or symposia for junior researchers with nationwide and international relevance in Germany.

8 German Chemical Society

The **German Chemical Society** provides a limited number of general conference travel grants – i.e. not bound to a specific conference – for active participation in national or international analytical conferences (i.e. with a poster or lecture/presentation on an analytical chemistry topic) to support junior researchers (students during their Bachelor's or Master's thesis, doctoral researchers and post-doctoral researchers without a permanent position).

9 Max Weber Foundation – German Humanities Institutes Abroad (DGIA)

The Gerald D. Feldman Travel Grant of the Max Weber Foundation (MWS) supports internationally oriented junior researchers in the humanities and social sciences. The visits are to be used for research, particularly in libraries and archives.

Description	Performance of research projects in at least 2 and up to 3 host countries of the institutes of the DGIA
Applicants	Junior researchers with a higher education degree

10 Stiftung für Kanada-Studien

The objective of the Stiftung für Kanada-Studien is to support Canadian studies in German-speaking countries by supporting junior researchers and the transatlantic transfer of information. The Foundation sees itself as a facilitator between business and science as well as between politics and research.

11 Stiftung Zeitlehren

The **Stiftung Zeitlehren** supports young academics whose projects relate to investigation and remembrance and/or are driven by a commitment to responsibly shaping contemporary society and the future of democracy. Doctoral researchers can apply for grants for travel and research costs for their research projects.

12 Fritz Thyssen Foundation

In addition to supporting research projects, the Fritz Thyssen Foundation also provides funding for smaller academic conferences and travel grants.

12.1 Travel grants

Description	Grants to cover travel expenses directly related to a research project in the area of the humanities, social sciences or biomedicine

13 Villa Vigoni – German-Italian Centre for the European Dialogue

Villa Vigoni is a binational association supported by the Federal Republic of Germany and the Republic of Italy. Together with the German Research Foundation (DFG) and the Fondation Maison des Sciences de l'Homme (FMSH), Villa Vigoni offers the opportunity to participate in bi- and trilateral programmes for scientific cooperation in the humanities and social sciences. Funding is provided in particular for trilateral conferences and doctoral/post-doctoral colloquia.

14 Volkswagen Foundation

Within the framework of 'Researching research', the **Volkswagen Foundation** offers funding for workshops and summer schools that aim to reflect, combine and experiment with the various methodological approaches or theoretical challenges in academic research. It is possible to apply for funding for a series of events consisting of up to three events that build on each other thematically.
