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
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

Important Documents For Your Stay Abroad

Checkliste = minimum requirements for recognition

Stay Abroad - Important Documents

We have compiled the most important documents (besides the official documents for your respective study programmes, which you can find here) for your stay abroad below.

These two documents every student should consult before their stay abroad:

- This checklist gives you an overview of the minimum requirements for the recognition of your stay abroad:
 Checkliste zum Auslandsaufenthalt im Fach Englisch
- You will have to fill in, sign, and send this document to us before your stay abroad to make sure that your stay abroad fulfils the
 minimum requirements:
 Vereinbarung zum Auslandsaufenthalt im Fach Englisch

These are documents that you will need for the recognition of your stay abroad after you have returned:

- If you study "Lehramt", you will need to submit this document together with all of the other supporting documents for your stay abroad:
 <u>ABESCHEINING SUMMARS AUGUSTANESS AUGUST</u>
- If you study in one of our BA or MA programmes, you will need to submit the following document together with all of the other supporting documents for your stay abroad: Logo Questionnaire for the portfolio on your stay abroad (BA 2016 and MA 2017)
- If you studied abroad and you would like to get credit for courses that you took abroad, you will have to fill in and sign the following document and send it to us, together with the official transcript of records from the university that you attended:
 <u>UdS Learning Agreement für Kursanerkennungen aus dem Ausland</u> (please note that despite the admittedly confusing name, this is not the same as your Erasmus Learning Agreement). If you didn't clear potential course recognitions before your stay abroad, you will also need to provide detailed information about the courses you took
- If you participated in the PAD FSA programme, this document contains information about the recognition of courses at UdS:
 Informationen zur Anerkennung von PAD Aufenthalten



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2) Requirements

Master (2017)

Single-subject MA: at least 3 months, 15 CP

Major in major/minor MA: at least 6 weeks, 8 CP

§ 7 Mobilitätsphase

(1) Studierende des Kernbereich-Master-Studiengangs American Studies/British Studies/English Linguistics müssen eine Mobilitätsphase von mindestens 3 Monaten absolvieren. Studierende des Hauptfachs American Studies/British Studies/English Linguistics müssen eine Mobilitätsphase von mindestens 6 Wochen absolvieren. Studierende des Nebenfachs American Studies/British Studies/English Linguistics können innerhalb des Pflichtmoduls "Vertiefungsmodul" eine Mobilitätsphase absolvieren. Die Mobilitätsphase ist im engen zeitlichen und fachlichen Zusammenhang mit dem jeweiligen Master-Studiengang American Studies/British Studies/English Linguistics abzuleisten.

2) Requirements: Country/Language

- You do not necessarily have to spend your mobility phase in an English-speaking country, even though we strongly recommend it
- You can also go to a non-English-speaking country if you work in an English-speaking environment OR study in an English Department, meaning the language of communication in the company/organization/office must be English
- e.g., British or American institutions/ organizations/ companies in Germany or abroad

Mobility phase and COP (2017)

(3) Studierende des Kernbereich-Master-Studiengangs und des Hauptfachs im 2-Fächer-Master-Studiengang American Studies/British Studies/English Linguistics können für die Dauer von höchstens einem Semester ein Auslandsstudium absolvieren. Dabei können insbesondere Leistungen im Rahmen der Module "Core Skills: Research Focus" oder "Career Orientation and Professionalization" erbracht werden. Durch darüber hinausgehende Leistungen, die im Auslandsstudium erbracht und mit CP belegt sind, kann maximal ein fachwissenschaftliches Master-Modul (13 CP im Kernbereich-Master-Studiengang bzw. 11 CP im Hauptfach im 2-Fächer-Master-Studiengang) ersetzt werden. Studien- und Prüfungsleistungen, die im Ausland erbracht wurden, werden anerkannt, soweit durch Fachvertreterinnen/Fachvertreter kein wesentlicher Unterschied hinsichtlich der erworbenen Kompetenzen festgestellt wird. Kein wesentlicher Unterschied hinsichtlich der erworbenen Kompetenzen ist festzustellen, wenn Studienzeiten, Studienleistungen und Prüfungsleistungen gemessen in Lernergebnissen den Anforderungen des Kernbereich-Master-Studiengangs American Studies/British Studies/English Linguistics genügen. Dabei wird kein schematischer Vergleich, sondern eine auf einer Gesamtbetrachtung beruhende Einzelfallbewertung vorgenommen.


Requirements: Choice of internship/study programme

- "Fachlicher Zusammenhang" =
- Your mobility phase
- ...will be beneficial to your future professional career.
- ...establishes a meaningful link between your MA at UdS and the internship/study programme you have chosen.
- · ...allows you to explore new fields of work that interest you.

3) Ideas for your mobility phase

Work experiences in...

- Cultural management and marketing (music/literature/theatre/comedy festivals; theaters, art galleries, publishing houses, literary agencies, any kind of event management and project management...), including the managing of social media accounts
- Diplomatic service (embassies etc)
- Book shops
- Charities / social institutions (e.g., Oxfam, UNICEF, UNHCR The UN Refugee Agency,...)
- Political/ activist organizations (e.g. feminist or LGBTQ groups, environmental activism, refugee support groups...) and volunteering
- IT sector (software development, game testing,...)
- Journalism / (Social) Media (blogs, newspapers, radio stations, TV stations,...)

How to find an internship

- On the internet: Ask Google! E.g.,

- On social media (Facebook, LinkedIn, etc., e.g., on the pages of the companies/organizations in question etc.)
- Old-school: Write an e-mail to the company or institution you are interested in. Most of the bigger companies also have a "We're Hiring/ Work for us" section somewhere on their website.

Erasmus+ Internship Requirements

- You have to be a student at UdS (your nationality does not affect your eligibility for the Erasmus+ programme)
- Your internship must be full-time and at least 60 days long (max. 12 months)
- Your internship must be completed in one of the countries that take part in the Erasmus programme (members of the EU plus UK, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Turkey; This does NOT include Switzerland)
- Students can receive funding once in each study cycle, for a total of up to 12 months (e.g., if you've already received Erasmus+ funding during your BA, you are still eligible for Erasmus+ funding during your MA)
- You have to fulfil the language requirements (which vary from country to country)
- You have to have insurance coverage
- The internship has to be relevant to your studies, but it does not have to be an obligatory internship

Erasmus+ study programmes

- No tuition fees
- Your receiving university often helps you to find an accommodation and offers cultural events and/or an induction or "Freshers" week
- Mobility grant (you have to stay longer than 3(!) months)
- You may be able to get credit points for the courses you completed abroad (talk to me in advance!)

Erasmus+ study programmes

- One semester: spring term / autumn term
- Check term dates!
- Check course catalogue and MA options
- Let me know well in advance because the application/nomination deadlines are different for each partner university (e.g., April-June for the autumn term and October-December for the spring term)

Erasmus+ study programmes in non-English-speaking countries

- Lecce, Italy (until 2024)
- Turin, Italy (until 2028)
- Valladolid, Spain (until 2027)
- Metz, France (until 2024)
- Sofia, Bulgaria (until 2024)
- Antalya, Turkey (until 2028)
- Kosice, Slovakia (until 2028)
- Warsaw, Poland (until 2024)

4) Funding (other than Erasmus+)

(two application deadlines a year: May 15 and Nov 15; applies to all projects which cannot be funded via Erasmus+; if you are not a German national, but have lived in Germany for more than 5 years, you are eligible to apply)

5) Tricky cases

- AuPair only in combination with other activities (e.g. language course(s), courses at a university, an internship,...)
- Work and Travel at your own risk: If you cannot find an adequate job (e.g., no farm/factory work!), your mobility phase will not be recognized

6) Bureaucracy: How to get the CP for your mobility phase

- 1. **Step**: Planning (6-18 months in advance, depending on where you want to go and what you want to do!).
- 2. **Step**: Talk to me before you leave (if you want funding: make sure you respect all the deadlines and get all the necessary signatures in time!) and submit the so-called "Vereinbarung" before you leave.
- 3. Step: If you want to study abroad, talk to me about your Learning Agreement and which courses you'd like to get credit for when you come back!
- 4. **Step**: Hand in your report/portfolio on your mobility phase within 6 weeks of your return, the cover sheet for the "Prüfungsekretariat" and the documents that prove that you did what we agreed on before you left.
- 5. **Step**: I'm going to check your report/portfolio and documents and send them to the "Prüfungssekretariat", which will then add your mobility phase to your ToR in LSF.

6) Bureaucracy: How to get the CP for your mobility phase

Portfolio (MA 2017):

- Fill in the questionnaire (in English) on your mobility phase available on the English Department's website
- Add the necessary documents:
 - 1. ToR or letter of recommendation from your employer stating the dates of your internship, your daily tasks, work language English;
 - 2. travel documents such as train tickets or boarding passes;
 - 3. proof of address such as lease or confirmation from landlord/-lady

6) Bureaucracy: How to get the CP for your mobility phase

- Proof: It's always best to have more than one of the following:
 - -ToR of your university
 - -Certificate of your internship or a letter of recommendation
 - -Erasmus+ documents
 - -Boarding passes / bus / train / ferry tickets
 - -Lease agreement / letter from your landlord/landlady
 - Visa documents

7) FAQ

- "Urlaubssemester": Consult the website of the Studierendensekretariat for more information!
- Insurance: Make sure your insurance cover is sufficient. If you are unsure, ask your employer if a special insurance is needed (e.g., a liability insurance)
- Visa: For questions about the visa process, ask the respective embassy or talk to Wolfgang Heintz at the International Office (for overseas visa)

7) FAQ

Brexit and Visa:

- If you want **to work/ do a work placement** in the UK, you will need a T5 visa, which will only be granted if you have a so-called "certificate of sponsorship" from a government authorized exchange scheme: https://www.gov.uk/government-authorised-exchange. You can find more information here: https://eu.daad.de/service/was-noch-bewegt/brexit/de/77316-hinweise-zum-brexit--erasmus-und-das-vereinigte-koenigreich/
- If you have questions about funding your internship in the UK with Erasmus+, please ask my colleagues at the IO, Bettina Jochum and Sandra Neumann.
- If you want to **study in the UK** and you will stay for no more than six months, you will not need a visa.
