Public introductory lecture according to § 5 of the Habilitation Regulations

The aim of the public introductory lecture is that the future habilitation candidate and his/her research activities are known to the faculty. In addition, the introductory lecture - along with the submitted documents - forms the basis for the recommendation of the habilitation committee regarding the acceptance of the habilitation candidate.

The introductory lecture should be generally understandable (interdisciplinary auditorium) and didactically prepared (also students in the auditorium).

No specialist lectures or conference contributions should be repeated, but the lecture should present the previous and planned research activities within the framework of the habilitation procedure.

The introductory lecture should inform both subject experts and interested parties of the faculty as a whole about the candidate's previous and intended career, in particular

- previous stages of the career as well as the goals pursued with the habilitation project,
- the content and results of previous research as well as the research programme and content-related goals for the habilitation period,
- previous teaching experience as well as goals in teaching for the habilitation period.

The date of the introductory lecture is to be coordinated with the Dean's Office and the members of the habilitation committee. According to the habilitation regulations, a minimum of four weeks' notice must be given.
