The proposed EU Talks 2024 initiative seeks to address the urgent need for increased cooperation and contributes to increasing digital literacy to counteract misinformation and enhance the integrity of our democratic processes".

- Case studies and best practices: we will introduce real-world examples of initiatives that successfully addressed disinformation;
- Cross-country learning and dialogue: we will facilitate interactive sessions for participants to share experiences and learn from one another;







Strategies for 2024 European elections: we will reflect upon actionable strategies to
mitigate the influence of pro-active right-wing tendencies during the upcoming EU
elections, emphasizing the importance of a unified front against divisive forces.
