Nomination & application

First the student should contact their home university international coordinator who needs to nominate the student by email to incoming@artun.ee, including the following nomination details:

- · First and last name
- Date of birth (dd.mm.yyyy)
- Gender
- Citizenship
- Email
- Field of study at home university
- Desired field of study at our university (BA or MA) and 2nd choice if applicable
- Current term
- Desired exchange term (fall/spring/whole year)

NOMINATION AND APPLICATION DEADLINE:

May 1 (for fall term and the whole academic year) **October 15** (for spring term)

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS:

- 1) Online application form (accessible one month before the deadline on our website: mobility.artun.ee
- 2) Portfolio: some images of your recent work or examples of your recent projects. Please add portfolio link in the application form (you can upload files in Google Docs or similar; the link has to be accessible without any log-in-procedure). You may also add other documents (see the list below) as a web link in the form or send it to incoming@artun.ee.
- 3) Motivation letter

- 4) Transcript of Records in English
- 5) Copy of your Passport or ID Card
- 6) Document photo in .jpg format
- 7) Document number on your passport or ld card
- 8) Certificate of knowledge of English language (min B2 level, not required from native speakers). It may be issued by your home institution if they have sufficient knowledge about your language level.

Grading system

Estonian Academy of Arts operates in ECTS system. Grading is in the scale A-F ("A" – Excellent to "F" – Insufficient) or Pass/Fail.

NB! Please note that most of the practical courses and electives in English are assessed as Pass/Fail and it cannot be changed individually for students who need grades (A-F).

After completed exchange, within one month after the official end of the term the student receives a digital Transcript of Records including ECTS credits. If a paper copy is needed, please email the respective postal address to incoming@artun.ee.


Practical information

ACCOMMODATION

Exchange students have an option to decide their place of accommodation in EKA. It can be either staying in EKA's dormitory or renting a private room or flat.

EKA shares a dormitory together with the Estonian Academy of Music and Theatre. The dormitory is called Muusa Majutus and it is conveniently located right in the city centre, Kuhlbarsi street 1. Their website is yhikas.eamt.ee.

It is common among international students to share bigger flats in the city centre. Rental prices in the centre may be a bit more expensive but one can cut costs and time on transportation. Splitting the rent among friends may offer an opportunity to find great accommodation at an affordable price.



VISA AND RESIDENCE PERMIT

EU citizens don't need a residence permit for studying, but they are obliged to register their place of living in Tallinn if staying longer than 3 months. As an exchange student of EKA, the condition is met by you and therefore you are kindly asked to visit one the city's Administration Offices (listed <u>HERE</u> on the right side) upon your arrival in Tallinn.

In addition, each exchange student has to apply for an Estonian ID-card within one month from obtaining the temporary right of residence. It can be done at one of the Police and Border Guard Board service offices (more HERE).

PS

As a resident of Tallinn, who has an Estonian ID-card, you are eligible to use public transportation for free in Tallinn.

Non-EU students, who come to study in EKA for 1-2 semesters, need to apply for a long-stay(D) visa: Requirements for D-visa

Please wait for the official acceptance letter before submitting your application at the nearest foreign representation of the Republic of Estonia. The list of Estonian representations can be found from HERE and it can take up to 10-30 days to process the visa application.

PS

The acceptance letter from EKA is one of the requirements for applying for the long-stay (D) visa.

After your arrival in Estonia, you can start your studies right away. No other registration for a legal stay is requested, which means the students with D-visa can not apply for an ID card.

HEALTHCARE

Medical help in Estonia is considered to be of high standard and it contains two types of health care systems: public and private. The public is provided by Estonian Health Insurance Fund, which normally stays out of reach for exchange students, unless being employed by the time spent in Estonia. Thus, exchange students are kindly advised to buy proper (travel) health insurance for the period of their studies in EKA. Even if they are EU/EEA citizens and hold a valid European Health Insurance Card, not all medical services are free of charge (covers only emergency cases) and additional health insurance is still widely recommended.
