The nomination should include the following information: name of the student, Email address, study area, study cycle and period of stay. Students are contacted directly by our office upon receipt of their nomination. Please send the nomination respectively to the regional coordinator in charge.

Please note, that we can only admit Erasmus+ students after receiving an official nomination! Deadline for the submission of the application documents: June 30 for the winter semester and/or the full academic year and December 31 for the summer semester.		

Language of Instruction	The main language of instruction for undergraduate studies is German . We recommend a minimum level of B1 for incoming students. A language certificate is mandatory for the following areas: • German language and literature studies: B2 (CEFR) German • Psychology: B1 (CEFR) German • Medicine Bachelor: B1 (CEFR) German • Medicine Master and Internships: B2 (CEFR) German

	Examination period	The examination dates will be announced in the courses. They usually take place in the last week of the lectures. However, some departments schedule their exams later in the lecture free period between the end of lectures and the end of the semester. Students must always check the examination period with their departmental coordinator!

If the number of applications exceeds the number of rooms available, we will not be able to accommodate every student. Costs of Living (estimated)	Living expenses average at 992 EUR per month (BA/MA students). The actual costs may vary. The proof of finance demanded by the visa office is 11.904 EUR/year (992/month) for student visa holders. • Semester fee: ~250 EUR (including public transport for ALL of Germany) • Accommodation: from 350 EUR / month • Health insurance: ~130 EUR /month • Food: 200 EUR / month • Additional private expenses
Semester Fee	There are no tuition fees applicable at the Saarland University. However, it is mandatory for students to pay a semester fee corresponding to: - The administrative cost related to the establishment of the Student ID card - The semester ticket which allows for public transportation in Germany The fee for exchange students is currently 228,10 EUR as of winter term 2026/27. The student ID card also entitles students to a various number of discounts e.g. subsidized meal prices in the canteen on campus and for several activities off-campus. Health Insurance	A valid health insurance is mandatory for the enrolment: Students can present either a European Health Insurance Card (if applicable) or alternative insurance. All incoming Erasmus students will be provided with detailed information about the health insurance (EU and Non-EU citizens).
