## I. General Guidelines

The manuscripts are to be submitted to [mueller@europainstitut.de](mailto:mueller@europainstitut.de). They can be written in German or English.

The Jean Monnet Papers have no restrictions concerning length. There must be an **abstract** at the beginning and a **bibliography** at the end of the document. Other than that, there are generally no set requirements about the structure of the papers. However, it is usual to start with an introduction, then to have the main body of the essay and to finish with a conclusion. Also, a **table of contents** would be desirable.

## II. Format

The papers must be submitted as **Word-Documents** with **footnotes**.

### III. Text guidelines

- Structure: **A. – I. – 1. – a) – aa)** – (1)
- Avoid abbreviations as much as possible. If abbreviations are used, they should be introduced, e.g.: Court of Justice of the European Union (CJEU).
- Make use of non-breaking spaces (ctrl. + shift + space) to avoid the separation of combined words or numbers.

### IV. Citation guidelines

- Detailed information on the author in a footnote with \* (title, position, University/Institution)
- Abbreviations: Art. for Artikel/Article; Abs. for Absatz; S. for Seite, p. for page; lit. for litera; Nr. for Nummer, No. for number; para./paras for paragraph(s)
- Authors: Last name in *italic*
- Editors: Last name not in italic with (Hrsg.)/(eds.)
- Rn./para.; S./p. at the end of the citation
- National court decisions can be cited in the corresponding national citation format

- International Organs

**decisions, reports, off. documents, comments, ...**

*Author*, official name, paragraph.

**Example:** HRC, General Comment No. 34, Art. 19: Freedoms of opinion and expression, UN Doc. CCPR/C/GC/34, 12 September 2011, Rn. 28.

**as “Court”**

*Author*, case number, *name*, reference, (date), paragraph.

**Example:** HRC, Communication Nr. 414/1990, *Mika Miba v Equatorial Guinea*, UN Doc. CCPR/C/51/D/414/1990, 10/08/1994.

## V. Bibliography

Every author cited in the article must be listed in the bibliography. Authors should be listed **alphabetically**. If there are more publications from the same author, they should be listed **chronologically**. If there is more than one author/editor, please separate the names by using a semicolon.

Font: Author(s) please in all caps; Title in italic; articles always with range of pages

### Detailed guidelines:

#### **Monograph:**

LAST NAME, FIRST NAME, *Title*, Edition, Location, Year

#### **Contributed volume:**

LAST NAME OF AUTHOR/S, FIRST NAME OF AUTHOR/S, *Title of essay*, in: Last name of Editor/s, First name of Editor/s; (eds.), Title, edition, Location, Year, pages of article within anthology

#### **Journal article:**

LAST NAME, FIRST NAME, *Title*, Journal name (full), Year, (Volume with number if possible), pages of article within journal.

**News article:**

LAST NAME, FIRST NAME, *Title*, Newspaper, Date (DD/MM/YYYY)

**Article on Website:**

LAST NAME, FIRST NAME, Title, Year/Date (DD/MM/YYYY), available at: URL [last accessed with date (DD/MM/YYYY)]

**VI. Abstract**

All authors should provide an abstract of their article **in a separate document**. The abstract cannot be no more than 200 words. It should be an objective representation of the article.

**VII. Keywords**

Please list (**in a separate document**) three to ten pertinent keywords specific to the article yet reasonably common within the subject discipline.
