



The Department of Economics in the Faculty of Human and Business Sciences at Saarland University is seeking applications for the following position to commence at the earliest opportunity:

W2 Professorship (W3 tenure track position) in Business Administration with a focus on Sustainability Management

(m/f/x; Reference no.: W2761)

This professorial position is a fixed-term public sector appointment ('Beamtenverhältnis auf Zeit') for a maximum period of six years. If the tenure evaluation procedure (teaching appraisal and external assessment of research work) is positive, the appointee will be promoted to a permanent professorship (lifetime tenure) at the German academic salary scale W3.

Applications are particularly welcome from highly qualified early career researchers pursuing dynamic, high-impact research with strong potential for innovation and interdisciplinary collaboration. The person appointed to this position will be responsible for the field of Sustainability Management within Business Administration, in both research and teaching. You should have a strong research profile, evidenced by relevant publications in leading, peer-reviewed international journals, at a level commensurate with the appointment. Proven experience in securing and delivering competitively awarded, externally funded projects is essential.

You will also contribute to teaching the subject across all business-related and economics degree programmes. You should also be willing to teach in German and English and to actively contribute to training in research methodology for doctoral students. You will also be expected to undertake university-related administrative duties appropriate to the position.

In addition, we expect you to develop and showcase synergies with existing sustainability initiatives at Saarland University. These include, in particular, the project CircularSaar and other relevant university initiatives and collaborations in the field of sustainability, for example in the departments of psychology and law.

Your research profile should be empirically oriented and should align with one of the existing areas of expertise within the Department of Economics (Digital Transformation, Europe, Entrepreneurship).

In accordance with the objectives of its gender equality plan, Saarland University is actively seeking to increase the proportion of women in this field. - If you hold a university degree from a non-German university, please provide proof of equivalence from Germany's Central Office for Foreign Education (ZAB) if available. If you have not yet requested proof of equivalence from ZAB, you must submit proof at a later date if so requested.
